Red Cross Water Safety Classes Set Parents' Minds at Ease

Nationally, drowning remains the second leading cause of unintentional injury-related death for children ages 1 to 14, which is why offering the most comprehensive aquatics training is vitally important for the safety of our youth.

Parents like the Bolins, from Canal Winchester, enroll their children (at right) in Red Cross Learn to Swim lessons each year and regard these lessons as a must. "You can watch your kids like a hawk, but they need to know what to do in the water. I enrolled them in swimming classes so they could help themselves if they had to," says Mom Heather.

Commodore Wilbert E. Longfellow began the American Red Cross Life Saving Corps in 1914 to reduce the number of lives lost as a result of drowning. Today, the Red Cross continues to be on the forefront of aquatics programming, partnering with aquatic facilities every year to teach more than 18,000 youngsters how to swim and nearly 2,000 lifeguards how to keep swimmers safe using the latest science for aquatics, first aid, CPR and AED.

Red Cross volunteers also bring water safety into the classroom, and a national online program offers home pool owners with the information they need to keep their family safe in

Neighborhood Residents No Longer Worry about Getting to the Doctor

In 2007 the JP Morgan Chase Foundation began addressing the needs of Weinland Park residents through a holistic effort to reverse the impact of decades of neglect. Weinland Park, the area bounded roughly by Chittenden Avenue on the north, the Conrail railroad on the east, East Fifth Avenue on the south and North High Street on the west, was a neighborhood defined by an unacceptable level of crime, resident instability



and concentrated poverty. Over the past three years, Chase has invested more than \$5 million in programs to strengthen and stabilize this neighborhood. Thanks to funding from the company, the Red Cross offers residents free transportation service to medical appointments.

Studies indicate transportation is a barrier that keeps people from accessing medical care. In the Weinland Park neighborhood 41% of residents don't have access to a car. Free Red Cross transportation means that mothers can get their children to regular medical check-ups and seniors have a safe way to get back and forth from medical treatments. "I would not be able to get to the doctor without this service," said a Weinland Park resident who recently rode with the Red Cross. "I am so pleased this service is available."
